- What** While on a long road trip, Bob and Harry stop to stretch their legs and see the scenery. But what they see isn't what they would expect. Themes: The Good Samaritan, Kindness, Compassion, Servant, Mercy, Neighbors, Parables
- Who** Bob
Harry
- When** Present Day
- Wear (Props)** Bob and Harry are dressed for traveling.
A railing for them to look over would be good.
- Why** Luke 10:25-37
- How** Keep it conversational and watch the timing. Bob and Harry have known each other for a long time, so make sure they are very comfortable, almost like an old married couple.
- Time** Approximately 2-3 minutes

Bob and Harry are facing the audience looking out over the Arizona landscape and marveling

Bob: *(Excited)* What a view! What a view! Isn't God just awesome? *(Points)* I could never make a mountain like that. Or that. Or...wow!

Harry: *(Irritated)* Must you? The view would be so much more enjoyable if we could hear the wind and the OTHER sounds of nature.

Bob: I was just expressing my awe of this view. It's really great...great.

Harry: I'm glad we stopped. I need to stretch. *(Stretches arms over head)*

Bob: What a view, blue sky, snow capped mountains, purple plains...

Harry: When you travel you cramp up. Good to stretch.

Bob: Cactus, sagebrush, sun scorched rocks, sun burned man, yucky little lizards.

Harry: *(Looks at Bob)* What did you just say?

Bob: Yucky little lizards.

Harry: Before that.

Bob: Sunburned man?

Harry: Where?

Bob: *(Points)* Down there.
