- When** Present
- Wear (Props)** Bathrobe for Judge.
- Why** Luke 11:5-8 & 18:1-8
- How** Keep it quick and conversational, but don't rush.
- Time** Approximately

*The **Widow** has comes to the **Judge's** "door" and knocks. The **Judge** comes to the door in his bathrobe.*

Judge: You again?

Widow: Yes sir.

Judge: It's the middle of the night!

Widow: Midnight.

Judge: I'm trying to get some sleep.

Widow: I was reading my Bible.

Judge: *(To audience)* There was a time I thought everyone should read the Bible. *(To **Widow**)* That's nice, Widow.

Widow: I read the parable of The Midnight Caller. Thought this would be a good time to ask you.

Judge: Ask me what? *(**Widow** waves papers at him)* You have been asking me to sign those settlement papers for the last six months.

Widow: You've been giving me the same answer for the last six months.
