- What** A Dad teaches his Son how to truly spell "Christmas". **Themes:** Christmas, Parents, Fathers, Sons, Jesus, Birth
- Who** Dad
Son- 10-12 years old
- When** Christmas; Present
- Wear (Props)** Set in a living room- Dad can be sitting in a chair or on a couch.
Paper with poem written on it.
- Why** Proverbs 22:6
- How** Keep this quick and conversational. Make sure you leave plenty of time to practice with your child actor.
- Time** Approximately 2-4 minutes

Dad is sitting in the "living room". Son enters.

- Son:** Dad, can you check my Christmas poem for me please?
- Dad:** Sure. (*Son hands Dad his poem*) Roses are red, violets are blue,
Christmas is awesome.
- Son:** Do you like it?
- Dad:** Well, your rhyming is "unique" but we have a bigger problem.
- Son:** What is it?
- Dad:** You spelled Christmas wrong.
- Son:** No I didn't.
- Dad:** Son, k-r-i-s-s-m-u-s is not how you spell Christmas.
- Son:** It isn't?
- Dad:** Nope.
- Son:** Are you sure?
- Dad:** Yep.
- Son:** How do you spell it then?
- Dad:** You know, I asked my third grade teacher that some question once.
- Son:** And what did she say?
- Dad:** (*Strong southern twang*) It's CHRIST, m-a-s.
