Theme: Prayer, Listening to God, Obedience

Defending the world from bad drama ... one skit at a time.

*The skit starts with **Mike** entering, kneels, and begins to pray. **God** enters.*

Mike: Our Father who is in heaven...

God: Yes?

Mike: Don't interrupt me. I'm praying.

God: You called me.

Mike: Called you? I didn't call you. I'm praying. *(Prays)*
Our Father who is in heaven...

God: There you did it again.

Mike: Did what?

God: Called me. You said, "Our Father which art in heaven." Here I am. Let's talk.

Mike: But I didn't mean anything by it. I was just saying my prayers for the day. I always say the Lord's Prayer. It makes me feel good.

God: All right. Go on.

Mike: *(Prays)* Hallowed be your name.

God: Hold it. What did you mean by that?

Mike: By what?

God: By "Hallowed be your name?"

Mike: It means... it means... Your name is hallowed!
You know like a hallowed...out.

God: Oh, so you think my name is "emptied out?"



Mike: No...that's not what I mean. Look, I don't know what it means. How should I know? It's not important, it's just part of the prayer. (*Goes back into praying mode. Pause. Then...*) By the way, what does it mean?

God: It means holy, set apart, honored, full of wonder.

Mike: Makes sense...Okay, I'm going to keep going now if it's okay. (*Prays*) Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

God: Do you really mean that?

Mike: Sure why not?

God: Well, if you want it, what are you doing about it?

Mike: Doing? Nothing, I guess. I just think it would be kind of neat if you got control of everything down here like you have up there.

God: Have I got control of you?

Mike: Well... I go to church.

God: That isn't what I asked you. What about your temper? You've really got a problem there. And what about the kind of TV that you watch? And then there's the way you spend your money... all on yourself.

Mike: Stop picking on me! I'm just as good as some of the rest of those people at the church.
