- Wear (Props)** Chris is dressed nicely with a tie; Scott is dressed very casual

- Why** Proverbs 31:28
- How** Be conversational and feel free to add in some of your own humor.
- Time** Approximately 3-5 minutes

Chris is standing at his Mom's front door about to go in. He is facing the audience.

Chris: Dude, get over here. Hurry. We gotta give Mom her Mother's Day gift. Hurry up and get over here.

Scott enters

Scott: Dude, I'm coming. Get off my back. Let's just get this over with. And don't talk like that to me.

Chris: Alright, let's get ready. Mom is gonna be so ready to see us. Hey, what are you wearing? It's Mother's Day. Couldn't you put on a tie or something? After all she had done for us, this is what you wear! Seriously.

Scott: This is fine man. Quit trying to suck up to Mom just because I'm her favorite.

Chris: That is so not true! I am the favorite.

Scott: No, you're not dude. I am the favorite! (*Hits Chris*)

Chris: Ow! You better quit or I'm gonna tell Mom what you did.

Scott: You tell Mom and you're gonna get it even worse.

Chris: Ok, ok, just chill. Let's just do this for Mom. This isn't about us, ok? It's about Mom. Truce?

Scott: Truce. (*Punches Chris*) Ok, let's go over the checklist. Last time, you went way off script and you got me in trouble. (*Pulls out note card.*)

Chris: What's this?

Scott: It's note cards. We have to stay on message.

Chris: Good idea. For the record, I still work at AT&T®.

Scott: Dude, no you don't. You've been unemployed for six months now. You got fired, remember?

Chris: I didn't get fired. They laid me off. And I'm holding out for a management position, ok? Mom doesn't need to know that? She'll just worry.

Scott: Alright, number two, I've lost 70 pounds.

Chris: You lost what? Where? Where did you lose it? I think it keeps finding you.

Scott: Just go with it.
